
Making Up Stories

Zora Neale Hurston was born in Alabama in 1891. She moved to Eatonville, Florida when she was 3.

When Zora was little, she listened to her neighbors tell stories. She also made up her own. Zora used her own homemade dolls to tell stories. She gave them names like Ms. Corn Shuck and Mr. Sweet Smell. In her stories, her dolls had many adventures!

Amazing Fact!

Young Zora made dolls out of soap, a spool of thread, a doorknob, and a cornhusk!


to know how people were the same and how they were different. She shared their stories with others. She also wrote stories about her life in the South.

Zora wrote poems, plays, and books.


She was one of the few African American women who was published at the time.
